## Fr Paul McDonald Appointed Our Administrator

Following the retirement of Fr. Michael Brady as Parish Priest of St. Joseph's Tweed Heads, the Bishop has appointed Fr. Paul McDonald as Administrator. This arrangement is seen as temporary until the Bishop is in a position to make a permanent appointment.

Fr Paul's role will be to meet regularly with the priests, parish staff and other groups to provide support and assist with organisation and administration. Most of the sacramental, pastoral and chaplaincy roles will continue to be undertaken by the priests and parish staff currently in Tweed Heads.

During this interim period this team approach is consistent with the journey of collaboration the parishes of the Tweed Valley (Murwillumbah, Tweed Heads and Kingscliff) have been travelling for almost the past twelve months.

Fr. Paul will continue as Parish Priest of Kingscliff and Vicar General, together with several other Diocesan commitments.

FR KEVIN EHLEFELDT MSC: many of our long term parishioners will remember Fr Kevin not just from his time supplying to our church, but growing up in our area.


Fr Kevin passed away in Sydney on 24 May at the age of 95. His Funeral was at the Sacred Heart Monastery, Kensington on Thursday 29 May. Fr. Kevin was born in Murwillumbah and grew up in Banora Point and Terranora before leaving at the age of 16 to join the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart.

He spent the last 20 years of his active ministry supplying throughout the Lismore Diocese, including the parishes of Tweed Heads, Murwillumbah and Kingscliff.

Our parish office has many fond memories of time spent with Fr Kevin, please keep him in your prayers.

## A SHARED RESPONSIBITY FOR GOD'S MISSION

The Italian composer Giacomo Puccini wrote famous operas such as La Boheme, Madama Butterfly and Tosca. It was during his battle with ter-1922 that cancer in he began write Turandot, which many consider his best work. He worked on the score day and night, despite his friends' advice to rest, and to save his energy. When his sickness worsened, Puccini said to his disciples, "If I don't finish Turandot, I want you to finish it." He died of a heart attack in 1924, leaving the work unfinished.



His disciples gathered all that was written

for *Turandot*, studied it in detail, and then proceeded to write the remainder of the opera. The world premier was in La Scala Opera House in Milan in 1926, and Maestro Arturo Toscanini, Puccini's favourite student, conducted it. The opera went beautifully, until Toscanini came to the end of the part written by Puccini.

He stopped the music, put down the baton, turned to the audience, and announced, "Thus far the master wrote, but he died." There was a long pause; no one moved. Toscanini then picked up the baton, turned to the audience and, with tears in his eyes, announced, "But his disciples finished his work." The opera closed to thunderous applause and has found a permanent place in the annals of great operas.

The Easter season concludes the public life of Jesus, but before he returns to the Father, he gathers his disciples. He asks them to be his witnesses to the world and continue his ministry by proclaiming the good news and under the influence of the Holy Spirit calling people to newness of life.

The feast of the ascension reminds us of our collective responsibility for mission. We are baptised into the community of believers and share an identity, but life as Catholic Christians is a call to share the mission of Jesus.

We may think that mission and evangelisation are the responsibility of clergy and religious, but they are the responsibility of all the baptised. Pope Francis consistently emphasises that the Church does not engage in proselytising but grows through "attraction" and the witness of lived faith, is how we best share the gospel message and invite others to follow Christ.

Jesus is no longer physically among us, but he reminds us that he journeys with us and that the Holy Spirit accompanies us in our journey through life.

Bearing witness does not necessarily mean speaking about our beliefs, although this is what happened with the first disciples. It means integrity of life where our actions match our words. It may also mean on occasion being willing to engage in dialogue with others who do not share our belief, but who have questions. Dialogue is an essential part of witness to our belief. Like the first disciples of Jesus and Puccini's disciples, it is our task to bring their work to completion.


The Jubilee is also known as the Holy Year and is an extraordinary and solemn event of the Catholic Church that occurs every 25 years.
